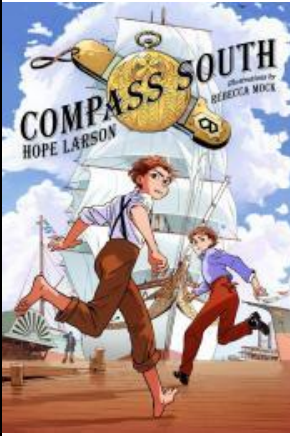

Neither Alex nor Cleo realizes the real danger they are in. They are being followed by pirates who think they hold the key to treasure. Full-color illustrations.

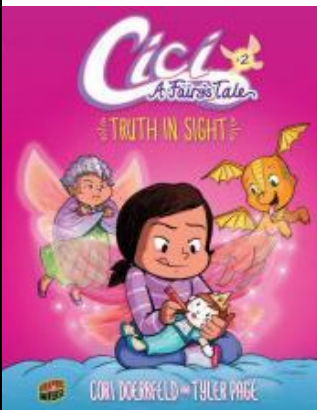


Mighty Jack

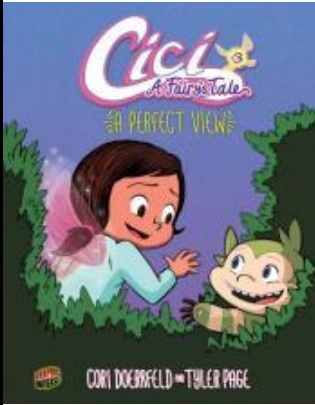

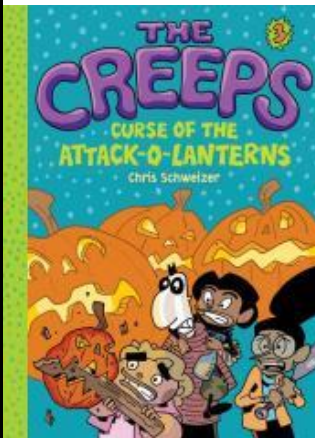
Part-human, part-fairy Cici works to figure out her newfound powers and her place at school. Full-color illustrations.

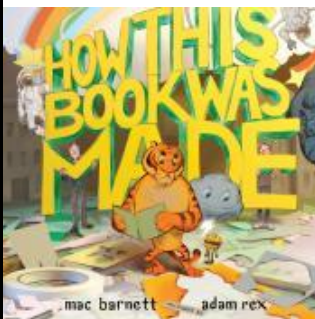

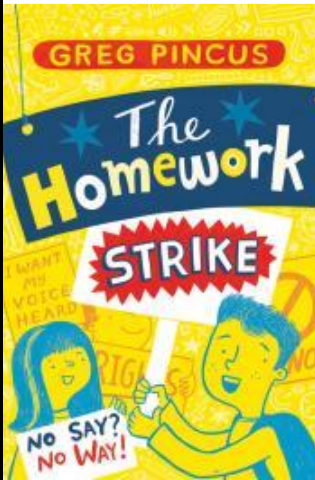

by Mac Barnett

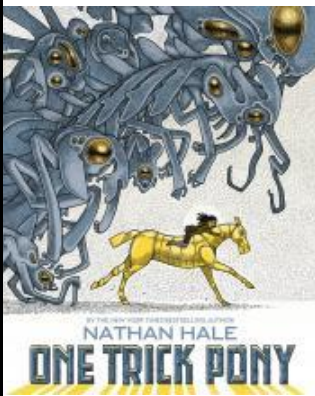

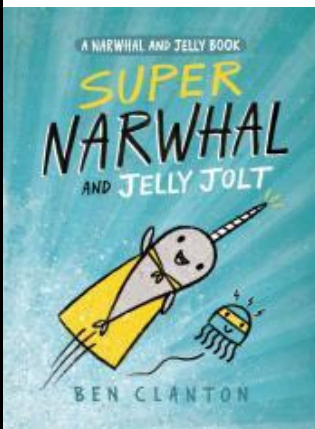
Gregory K., overwhelmed by homework, decides to make a stand—but the stand takes on momentum of its own and Gregory has to live with the consequences.
